LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Butterfield Secrets

Over the past 5 years that I have had the privilege to be your President, I have learned a great deal about the subdivision that even I, who grew up in this area, was not aware. I used to walk from my home on Avondale Lane, through the field and apple orchard where 1355 now stands, to attend grade school at Glen Park School for grades 1-4, the building still remaining today as The Fountain of Life Church. As the Baby Boomers and Generation X, the latter of which I am a member, tapered off to the more modest-sized generations that followed, attendance rapidly dropped and Glen Park School was closed. I was then bussed over to Butterfield Elementary School to complete grades 5-6, learning about the opposite side of the subdivision from where I lived, and making more friends in the process. During my time growing up in Butterfield I also went through Cub Scouts, Webelos, and Boy Scouts, played countless hours of football and baseball, biked and hiked throughout most of the subdivision, met several Butterfield girls, some of whom I would later date, and even learned how to play the cello. However, I learned little or nothing about the history of Butterfield itself, who built it, and why.

During my time serving as President of the Butterfield Homeowners Association, I have been able to fill in my gaps of knowledge regarding the history of Butterfield, and the area in which we live, even before Butterfield was founded in 1961. Who built our subdivision and when, how the entrance signs and other landmarks were built, and even details about the various members who have served as officers of the BHA over the years — some of whom were parents of some of the kids I went to school with. Almost all of them have retired and moved out of the subdivision, and their histories have now passed into memory, but some of the mysteries of Butterfield remain, small but interesting facts and figures which continue to make themselves known as I dig deeper into the details of Butterfield, and BHA, history.

One of the more recent mysteries that we have been exploring are the "secret sidewalks", of which there are two, that very few people know about except those who live in their immediate vicinity. I myself was aware of them but have not used them since I was a kid, and I had long since forgotten where they were located. The sidewalks, which we discuss in more detail on page 8 in our "Local Focals" article, have fallen into disrepair in recent years, and as we look into how best to maintain them we are discovering that no one is exactly sure who has authority over them — whether the county, the townships, or the BHA itself. Kathy Shapiro presented feedback on the status of the mass-mailer letter that was included in the Fall, 2017 issue of the BHA newsletter requesting that IDOT build a pedestrian and bicycle barrier and walkway along the Illinois Route 56 (Butterfield Road) bridge over Interstate 355 (<https://bit.ly/2sK6W8X>). The Illinois Department of Transportation responded to her husband, Terry Shapiro, that there were no plans to put in a pedestrian sidewalk along the sides of the Butterfield Road bridge anytime soon. However, they suggested that Terry contact the Downers Grove Mayor, which he is in the process of doing, along with contacting local busi-

Open Forum

During the Open Forum, when attendees can ask questions and bring up matters of their own related to homeownership, there was some discussion regarding the noise coming from I355, and possibly raising the fence a little higher near the Beacon Hill retirement home. There has also been some talk about possibly widening Butterfield Road, and adding fencing there as well, but nothing has been done to this point.

There was also some discussion regarding the work done by the townships last year on the sidewalks. That work was helpful to remove the worst of the sidewalk issues, but much work remains to be done. Please contact your township to report problem sidewalks. Contact information can be found here: <http://mybhoa.com/local-government/> Striping for the crosswalks also needs to be done more often, as it is not always done every year. Please contact the townships regularly regarding maintenance and related issues and remind them to keep Butterfield beautiful.

Attendees also discussed how Butterfield used to be more

active, with people attending parties and picnics outside on a more regular basis. People are staying more at home now, mainly due to increased workloads and Internet/social media taking up most of their free time. We need to encourage people to get out and meet more of their neighbors, make better use of our parks, and so forth, whether through the BHA, or through their own social networks. Finally, we discussed the “secret sidewalks” and who is responsible for their upkeep. Some of the trees near the two secret sidewalks are dead or dying and need to be cut down for safety reasons, so we need to determine who has the responsibility to cut down dead trees and keep the secret sidewalks safe. The old tornado siren was also discussed, another thing that needs to be upgraded to help ensure the safety and security of the people of Butterfield.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:49 PM.

Local Focals

This issue we have no big stories, but several smaller issues we need to discuss. So, we have once again assembled a group of "local focals", various topics of interest that we will be discussing at our next meeting on June 21st at the Fountain of Life Church at 7:30. Please attend and let us know what is important to you, and we will make it a priority.

BROKEN SIDEWALKS

Last year, after numerous complaints and some reports of significant injuries due to the broken sidewalks, both the Milton and York township highway commissions banded together to fix the most dangerous areas, promising to complete the job this year. Please call Milton Township Highway Commissioner Gary Muehlfelt at 630-682-4270, or York Township Highway Commissioner Dick Schroeder at 630-627-2200 to remind them to fulfill their promises and complete the job they started last year.

SECRET SIDEWALKS

Butterfield, which was founded in 1961, is starting to show its age, and some of its secret ways are in need of repair. The two secret sidewalks, one connecting Glen Park Road to Hampton Lane, and another connecting Coronet Road to Briarcliff Road, were built by the builders of the subdivision, F&S Construction Co. (later the Hoffman Rosner Corp.), mainly in order for kids to have shortcuts between these very long blocks. The BHA is in the process of assessing who is responsible for their upkeep, whether the county, the townships, or the BHA itself. Their provenance is unclear, and residents bordering the sidewalks are concerned that the trees, some of which are dead or dying, may fall onto their property. If you have information regarding the secret sidewalks, which have not been well documented and remain one of the mysteries of Butterfield, please contact us at 630-627-4845, butterfieldhomeownersassoc@gmail.com.

ENTRANCE LIGHTS & LANDSCAPING

Recently, some of the entrance lights have become burned out, and the landscaping has not been kept up as well as it used to be. This is because the Schroeders, who have done a wonderful job volunteering for the last few years to manage the landscaping and change the light bulbs when they burn out, have retired from active duty from the Landscaping Committee. We need new people to step up and volunteer to help manage the landscaping at the entrance signs, or else the entrances to our fair subdivision will not be as presentable as they once were — especially in the spring, when weeds and grass grow so rapidly. CAR BREAK-INS

Last year, at least 88 cars from one end of the subdivision to the other, from Lloyd Avenue to Avondale Lane, were coolly ransacked by a group of professional thieves who

stole thousands of dollars of cash and personal items. Please remember to lock your car doors and roll up your car windows, as all of the cars that were robbed had open windows and/or doors. The DuPage County Sheriff's Office has made it clear every time they have spoken at our meetings that the police want you to use 911 to call in reports of suspicious characters, and they mean it. We are the eyes and ears of the police, who cannot be everywhere at every time. We are partly responsible as homeowners for the safety and security of our neighborhood, so please take the advice that we regularly publish in print and online seriously. Keep track of suspicious people, keep your houses and yards well lit at night, trim your bushes so that there is nowhere for criminals to hide. We provide this information for you so we all can live in a safe and secure Butterfield.

MOSQUITO SPRAYING

Recently some people have complained about the rise of the mosquito population in certain areas of our subdivision. The townships contract out their mosquito spraying, and they have money budgeted for only four sprayings per year. We have discussed the issue with the contractors responsible for the spraying, and they are willing to do additional sprayings, but we will have to pay for them ourselves. Please attend our next meeting on June 21st at the Fountain

of Life Church at 7:30 if you wish to have us allocate money to have our subdivision receive additional sprayings — we do not know what you need us to do if you do not tell us. In the meantime, remember to empty out all vessels in your yards that can hold rain water, such as buckets, bird baths, even small cans — mosquito larvae need very little water in which to breed.

GLENBARD WASTEWATER AUTHORITY

Last year, the large water processing plant west of the DuPage River had some issues with processing that resulted in strong sewer smells that were permeating the west side of Butterfield, and also especially Butterfield West. The GWA had installed some new “digesters” in order to better handle food waste, but the digesters “burped”, and the result was a massive amount of fumes from the rotting food waste being dispersed all over Butterfield East, West, and much of eastern Glen Ellyn. If this happens again please contact us immediately and we will get involved to make sure this does not happen again.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!

Finally, as our membership ages and moves into retirement, new volunteers are needed to replace the previous volunteers, some of whom have been serving for decades. Contact us at 627-4845, butterfieldhomeownersassoc@gmail.com.






